Having been brought up in a Christian home, I knew the Gospel from I was very young, but it wasn't until I was 13 years old that I trusted in the Lord for salvation. At 16 I was introduced to Child Evangelism Fellowship® and from then on, I spent my summers helping in 5-Day Clubs®, Holiday Bible Clubs and Camps, before becoming involved in Junior and Senior Youth Challenge.

After 14 years working with Ulster Bank, in 2001 the Lord began to challenge me about my service for Him and, over the next months, He opened the door into CEF. I applied and was accepted as a candidate in 2002 and then spent 10 years in the Youth Challenge Department.

Part of my role in YC was teaching at the Summer Outreach Training Course and in 2010 I began to teach at the Children's Ministry Leadership Course in our European HQ. I've always enjoyed teaching and in 2012 the Lord challenged me about moving to the Education Department within the mission and in November that year I was appointed Team Leader for the Department.

My role is mainly training others how to reach and then teach children the Word of God. In CEF we run various training courses, but I also work with churches in training their Sunday School teachers and children's workers, and with other mission organisations too.
